We are delighted to invite you to participate in the International Student Workshop organized by the Wood Camp Academy, which will take place at the EcoCampus of the Fédération Compagnonnique Occitanie from August 17 to 27, 2025. The theme for this year's workshop is:

« Living with Major Risks: Building Sustainable Emergency Housing »,

reflecting the pressing challenges of contemporary society, including climate, economic, and migration crises that concern us all.

The theme of major risks examines the concept of "sustainable emergency" beyond immediate humanitarian responses to disasters. Can emergency housing evolve into resilient housing that withstands future risks? How can existing structures be transformed to become resilient? Should risk-responsive housing rely on industrial solutions, or can it be built using vernacular expertiseand self-construction? How do we address essential services needed for livability—water, energy, food, comfort, etc.?

What is Wood Camp Academy?

Wood Camp Academy is a network of partners* dedicated to designing and organizing international workshops focused on timber construction and bio-based materials.

Its mission?

To promote **HANDS-ON LEARNING** through concrete, sustainable projects that cover all techniques related to timber construction.

En quoi consiste le Workshop?

10 teams of 8 students, from mixed fields (engineering, architecture, journeymen carpenters and joiners) and diverse countries, will work collaboratively on a timber construction project—from conception to execution.

The Workshop in 3 Key Phases!

During the preparatory phase, teams will analyze and position their approach and prepare a short presentation.

At this stage, the aim is not a finalized project but rather a thorough understanding of identified risks and the context of a chosen location.

A preliminary online meeting with mentors will be held in early July for progress updates.

For teams wishing to explore existing construction solutions (e.g., post-and-beam systems, modular construction), industrial partners will provide technical support.

During the Workshop, each team will design a **housing module** suited to the chosen location, ranging from standalone individual units to small collective housing.

The deliverables will include a large-scale model showcasing construction solutions, potentially complemented by detailed or full-scale (1:1) samples, along with an exhibit-ready presentation panel.

Deliverables will be designed to facilitate transportation for exhibitions across France and Europe.

Phase 1: Preparatory Phase

Phase 2: Workshop Phase

Dates: Sunday, August 17, to Wednesday, August 27, 2025

Where: EcoCampus of the Compagnons du Tour de France in Toulouse (Plaisance du Touch)

Dive into the design, architecture, and model-making phases. The Workshop includes: a design phase and a fabrication phase, and guidance by professionals and experts from engineering firms, training institutions, architects, and organizations from France and abroad.

Phase 3: Final Presentation

As part of the *«Builders of Tomorrow» event held at the EcoCampus in Plaisance du Touch, an international jury will select the winning model of 2025. The winning project will be constructed at full scale and transformed into a pavilion for the 2026 edition. You will also have the opportunity to help build the full-scale version of the winning project from the previous year.

Looking Back at the 2023 Workshop

August 27 to September 8, Bordeaux

Under the presidency of renowned Japanese architect Shigeru Ban, the 2023 architecture workshop led by KOZ and Archi Depot Tokyo focused on designing and building models of lightweight, temporary wooden shelters adaptable to various needs: emergencies, seasonal housing, etc.

Thirty students from ENSAP Bordeaux, Ukraine, and Japan participated.

The winning model, «Bedroom», unveiled at the 2023 Woodrise Congress, is currently being built at full scale for display at the Festival des Cabanes in June 2025 at Pyla-sur-Mer.
